The iPi Group AGM

On Tuesday the 1st November, 2011 it wasn't the running of the Melbourne Cup which brought Porgera to a stand-still, but rather the Annual General Meeting of the iPi Group.

Approximately 2,000 shareholders, Directors, Executives, Managers, Stakeholders and Employees were invited to brave the cold to listen to Director and Chief Executive Officer Scott O'Reilly speak about the progresses made over the past twelve or so months. After the shareholders function the Board and Management joined with Wasa Aliape, a long serving holding Board Director and more recently Director on subsidiary boards, whom had retired at the AGM and whom was farewelled with a function at the iPi Group's Mountain Lodge.

The expectation is that our new bulk tankers will be arriving in Papua New Guinea in a staggered manner but during the months of Dec 2011 and January 2012. They also were also crowned the champions in the B grade after defeating Kairik Jets 10-8.

Under heavy police presence the game went right down to the wire until Paiam Rocks had to overcome a strong fight-back to seal victory.

In the A grade, Rocks got first points on the board after a high shot on lock Otto Sam on the 20m mark 15 minutes

into the game.

To each and all in the iPi Transport Management Team, my sincere thanks for the many hours of application and focus much of it after hours in fact, you have not once let slide the importance of our other valued Clients; simply embraced all Clients equally and in a measured fashion.

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iPi Transport Our Fleet (GPS) Tracking System



Readers of the 'Insider' will have noted a number of previous but like articles; these in prior editions which specifically relate to the iPi Group's iPi Transport Division and the embracing of high-end technology and inclusion of the same within our in-country haulage operations. I thought better, given this opportunity, to offer our valued readers an update on the Fleet (GPS) Tracking System, the applications, the installations and importantly, where we are at given the 2011 year end.

Yes our Transport arm is currently heavily involved in the installation of the associated electronic equipment; apparatus in effect is being wired in on all Prime Movers, Rigid vehicles, Light vehicles, bulk tankers, D-Tanks, standard and step deck trailers and various other ancillary gear. We are approximately 70% into the total project and going strongly.

In conjunction with the above and on-going installations, the monitoring side of the Project is equally being attended to. It is in the Fleet Control Centre, we call it the 'Situation Room'; this located in Lae that all oversight of data is being fed back and collated. The highly skilled personnel responsible for the handling and management of the downloads on all information coming off the Satellite Tracking System monitor the live feeds, they record all data and information, transmit and or relay messages-orders-customer feedback, update all vehicle movements and locations, send vehicle estimated times of arrivals (ETA's) to relevant depots and observe/respond to vehicle monitoring events/alerts.

As more vehicles in the fleet come on line, they too have recorded daily logs generated. Each vehicle has a full audit trail

and this is inclusive of general movements between digitised locations, departure and arrival times, stopping times-locations and further, trip utilization reports. It is within the latter that information such as start time of the first trip of the day through to the last point of the day including driving-stopping-idling times, distances travelled between points, speed information and a fuel usage record.

G-Force sensors are also being fitted to all vehicles and these will monitor critical functions in relation to hard-harsh braking, heavy acceleration, fast cornering and the like.

Driver Access ID is yet another positive advancement in the software being installed. Significant driver awareness training is due to be delivered very soon. Drivers will require a full orientation of the fleet protection systems and the overall capabilities and process functions. A key part of driver familiarisation is that each driver is aware of the real-time tracking of the vehicle they are in-charge of; that the vehicles are being constantly monitored 24 hours a day inclusive of all stops and duration times of the same. Further, that they are aware of the tracking of fuel usage, speeds according to various road conditions and or surfaces, harsh braking and heavy or aggressive cornering, free-wheeling in neutral and, that each vehicle has a voice kit communication system onboard capable of two way immediate and direct conversation.



A great degree of detailed background work has gone into the development of the specific highlands highway (and general surrounds) software package. We have had embedded into the system over 200 digitized locations from Morobe through to the Southern Highlands and Enga Provinces. There are speed restriction zones which include mountain passes, gradients of various degrees, hazardous or difficult bridges, sharp or difficult corners, generally recognised road black-danger spots, legal and dangerous stopping points, customer-Client locations-drop points-offices-depots-gantries-fuel farms, iPi Transport Depots/ locations inclusive of particular areas such as wash down points, parking areas, truck and trailer go-lines, load ready areas and workshop sections.

We congratulate Petro Master Systems-Master Systems Technologies for thus far, a job very well done. The professionalism displayed and the innovative manner in-which they go about the installation and monitoring-reporting of the equipment hardware-software have been noted. We take the time to proudly acknowledge Mr Harold Richardson (Managing Director of Master Systems Technologies) who has personally involved himself in and at all levels of the commissioning process and, with the on-going stewardship of the Fleet Control Centre.

My professional thanks also are extended to Daryl Diehl who has continually and diligently championed the need for total fleet monitoring and management.

iPi Transport is not the first trucking company to have GPS tracking on a fleet of vehicles, however it is important and relevant to both understand and appreciate, we are the leaders in specific PNG based applications and associated Client responsive reporting. Not only is it vital that we have complete and unfettered control on where any of our vehicles are at any one time but equally, we have an obligation to ensure the safety of our drivers; that they too equally and mutually recognise their professional obligations as safe and competent users of the roads-highways plus, we must maintain at all times, our deep respect and understanding of our highly valued Clients given the very cargo we carry for them. Our highly advanced tracking system embraces all this and more.
